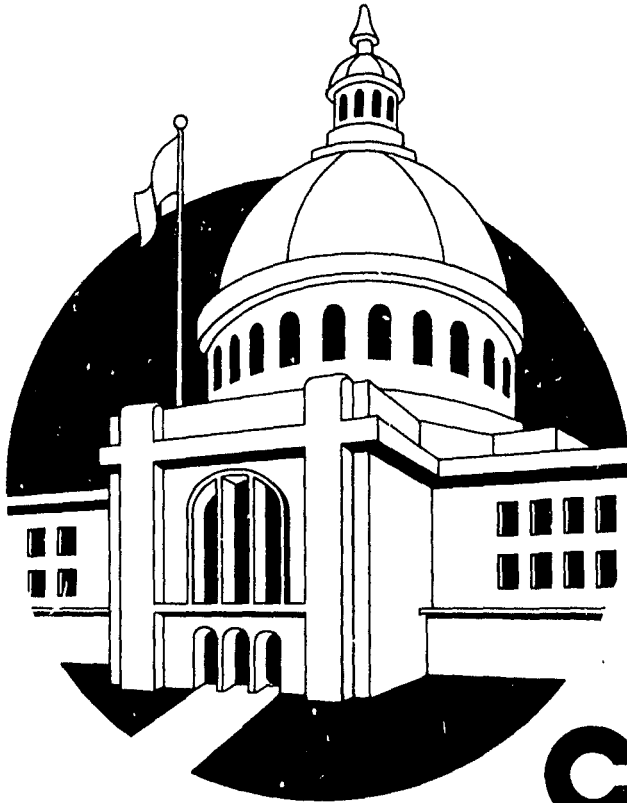

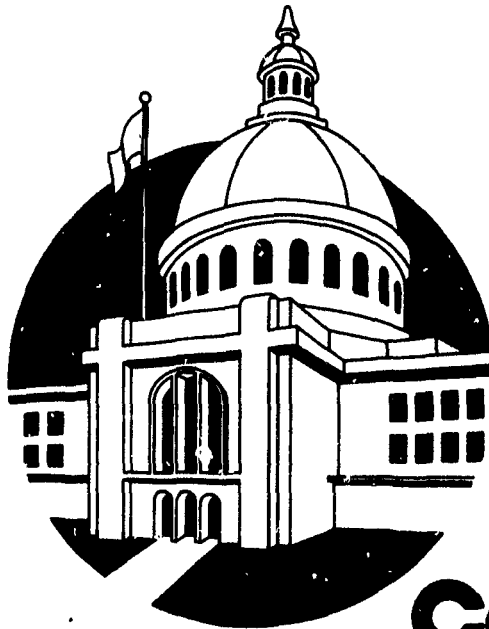

A census of governments is taken at 5-year intervals as required by law under Title 13, United States Code, Section 161. It is further specified in Chapter V, Section 191 of the same title that each of the censuses authorized by this chapter shall include each State, the District of Columbia, the Virgin Islands, Guam and the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico. This volume gathers available comparable data on public employment and governmental finances for these outlying territories of the United States.

PUERTO RICO

There were 78 local governments in Puerto Rico in January 1982. In Puerto Rico, the municipio governments resemble county governments in that they are composed of, and perform services for, both urban and rural areas.¹ The entire area of the Commonwealth is encompassed by municipio governments. The mun-

icipios constitute county equivalents for purposes of population statistics, and are therefore counted as county governments in census statistics on governments. Each municipio is governed by an elected mayor, or alcalde, and an elected municipal assembly.

The barrios are geographical subdivisions from which members of both the Puerto Rico Legislative Assembly and the municipal assemblies are elected; they are not counted as independent local governments. Some barrios or groups of barrios are called "ciudades" (cities) or "pueblos" (towns); see "Municipal Governments" below.

In Puerto Rico, the Commonwealth Government or its public authorities provide fire protection, police, water supply, sewerage, park, education, and most hospital and public health services for the municipios (see "Subordinate Agencies and Areas," below). The most important functions provided by the municipios are paving and maintenance of streets and plazas; garbage collection; operation of cemeteries, markets, slaughterhouses and municipal jails; and public welfare.

MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENTS

There are no governments in Puerto Rico that are counted as independent municipal governments for census purposes. Municipio governments (see "Municipio Governments," above) are counted as county governments. In Puerto Rico, the ciudades (cities) and pueblos (towns) consist of a barrio or group of barrios that constitute the governmental center of the municipio. Although ciudades and pueblos in Puerto Rico have legally established limits, they do not constitute governments; they are geographical subdivisions of the municipios only.

TOWNSHIP GOVERNMENTS

There are no governments in Puerto Rico that are counted as independent township governments for census purposes. Each municipio is divided into barrios; the pueblos (towns) in Puerto Rico consist of a barrio that constitutes the governmental

center of the municipio. Although barrios and pueblos in Puerto Rico have legally established limits, they do not constitute governments; they are geographical subdivisions of the municipios only.

PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEMS

School District Governments

There are no independent school district governments in Puerto Rico. The public school system in Puerto Rico is classified, for census purposes, as a dependent activity of the Commonwealth Government. Since 1946, all educational activities have been supported exclusively by appropriations from the central government to the Department of Education, and ownership of all public school buildings and property is vested in the Commonwealth.

Puerto Rico is divided into "school districts" which are administrative areas of the Commonwealth Department of Education, and are not counted as governments for census purposes. Each municipio constitutes a school district except the capital (San Juan), which has four districts; Bayamon and Ponce, which have two districts each; and the island of Bulebra, which is part of the district of its neighboring municipio, Vieques. Each of these "school districts" has a superintendent of schools appointed by the Department of Education.

SPECIAL DISTRICT GOVERNMENTS

There are no governments in Puerto Rico that are counted as special district governments for census purposes.

SUBORDINATE AGENCIES AND AREAS

In Puerto Rico, there are a number of public agencies which derive a substantial part of their revenues from the operation of their facilities. These agencies, however, are either organized as parts of established departments of the Commonwealth Government, or have boards consisting of officials of the Commonwealth Government in an ex officio capacity or of members appointed by the Governor of the Commonwealth. These agencies are classified, for census purposes, as subordinate agencies of the central Commonwealth Government, and are not counted as independent local governments. VIRGIN ISLANDS

There were no local governments in the Virgin Islands as of January 1982.³ All governmental functions are performed by the Territorial Government.

COUNTY GOVERNMENTS

The three largest islands of the Virgin Islands--St. Croix, St. John, and St. Thomas--are classified as county equivalents in population statistics.⁴ However, these islands are not counted as governments. There are no governments in the Virgin Islands which are counted as county governments for census purposes.

MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENTS

There are no municipal governments in the Virgin Islands. The three towns--Charlotte Amalie, Christiansted, and Frederiksted--have no self government.

TOWNSHIP GOVERNMENTS

The census subdistricts in the Virgin Islands (formerly known as "quarters") have boundaries defined by law and are classified as minor civil divisions for

purposes of population statistics. However, these census subdistricts are not counted as governments. There are no governments in the Virgin Islands which are counted as township governments for census purposes.

PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEMS

School District Governments

There are no independent school district governments in the Virgin Islands. The public school system in the Virgin Islands is operated by the Department of Education of the Territorial Government.

SPECIAL DISTRICT GOVERNMENTS

There are no governments in the Virgin Islands that are counted as special district governments for census purposes.

SUBORDINATE AGENCIES AND AREAS

In the Virgin Islands, a number of governmental functions, including highways, hospitals, parks, police and fire protection, public health, public welfare, sewerage, and water supply, are provided by departments of the Territorial Government rather than by local governments. In addition, the following agencies are classified as subordinate agencies of the Territorial Government and are not counted as separate governments:

GUAM

There were no local governments in Guam as of January 1982. All governmental functions are performed by the Territorial Government.

COUNTY GOVERNMENTS

The entire Territory of Guam comprises a single county area for purposes of population statistics. There are no governments in Guam which are counted as county governments for census purposes.

MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENTS

There are no municipal governments in Guam. The cities and villages in Guam are unincorporated communities.

TOWNSHIP GOVERNMENTS

Guam is divided into 19 election districts for electoral purposes. These districts are classified as minor civil divisions for population statistics. These districts, however, are not counted as governments. There are no governments in Guam which are counted as township governments for census purposes.

PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEMS

School District Governments

There are no independent school district governments in Guam. The public school system in Guam is operated by the Department of Education of the Territorial Government.

SPECIAL DISTRICT GOVERNMENTS

There are no governments in Guam which are counted as special district governments for census purposes.

SUBORDINATE AGENCIES AND AREAS

In Guam, such functions as highways, parks, police and fire protection, public health, and welfare are performed by departments of the Territorial Government rather than by local governments. In addition, the following agencies are classified as subordinate agencies of the Territorial Government, and are not counted as separate governments:

- Guam Educational Telecommunications Corporation
- Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority
- Guam Housing Corporation

- Guam Memorial Hospital Authority
- Guam Power Authority

- Public Defender Services Corporation
- Public Utility Agency of Guam (water and sewer facilities)

DATA PRESENTED

For each of the outlying governments a summary of assessed valuation, public employment and governmental finances are presented in Table 1. More detail is presented for the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico in Table 2 through 5. It should be noted the items presented in these tables are limited to available data and tempered by differences in accounting principle and presentations made in local commonwealth reports. Tables 6 through 8 contain equivalent information for the Territory of the Virgin Islands. The Territory of Guam is reported on Tables 9 through 11.

PUBLICATION PROGRAM

The 1982 Census of Governments, similar to those taken every 5 years since 1957, covers four major subject fields relating to State and local governments—governmental organization, taxable property values, public employment, and governmental finances.

The results are being issued in one preliminary report and eight volumes, which are described below. Publications order forms for specific reports may be obtained by writing to the Data User Services Division, Customer Services Branch (Publications), Bureau of the Census, Washington, D.C. 20233.

PRELIMINARY REPORT

This report presents preliminary data from the Directory Survey of Local Governments on the number of governments by type.

Number 1. Governmental Units in 1982

VOLUME 1. GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION—1 report (GC82(1))

Data are presented at the national level, by States, and for SMSA's on county, municipal, and township governments by size classes; on public school systems by size of enrollment, by grades provided, and by number of schools operated; and on special district governments by function performed. The report also includes a summary description of governmental structure in each State.

VOLUME 2. TAXABLE PROPERTY VALUES AND ASSESSMENT/SALES PRICE RATIOS—1 report (GC82(2))

This volume presents data on amounts of assessed value (gross and net) officially determined in 1981 for local general property taxation, for counties, and for each city having a 1980 population of 50,000 or more, with totals for States. The data include estimates of locally assessed realty distributed among major use categories.

The report also provides statistics, based on a sampling within 2,000 local assessing jurisdictions throughout the United States, on real properties involved in measurable sales during a 6-month period of 1981. Statistics include assessment-sales ratios and dispersion coefficients applicable to single-family (nonfarm) houses and certain other realty.

VOLUME 3. PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT—3 reports (GC82(3) 1 to 3)

Number 1. Employment of Major Local Governments—This report presents statistics on October 1982 employment and payrolls of individual major local governments. Data are presented individually for all county governments, municipalities (and townships in selected States) with 10,000 or more population, school systems with 5,000 or more enrollment, and special districts having 100 or more full-time employees.

Number 2. Compendium of Public Employment—This report is a comprehensive summary of public sector employment, payrolls, and employer costs for selected employee benefits as of October 1982. Employment and payroll data are shown by governmental function. Data are summarized nationally and by States. Local government statistics are also summarized for each county area; by population-size group for counties, municipalities, and townships; by enrollment-size group for school districts; and by employment-size group for special district governments.

Number 3. Labor-Management Relations in State and Local Governments—This report is a national and State-by-State summary of labor-management relations in State and local governments as of October 1982. Statistics include the number and percent of employees who belong to an employee organization; number of governments with a labor relations policy; number of contractual agreements and number of employees covered by contractual agreements; number of employee bargaining

units; and work stoppages which occurred between October 16, 1981, and October 15, 1982.

VOLUME 4. GOVERNMENTAL FINANCES—5 reports (GC82(4) 1 to 5)

This volume presents statistics on revenue, expenditure, debt, and financial assets of State and local governments.

Number 1. Finances of School Districts—Selected financial items are shown for enrollment-size groups of public school systems and individual school systems enrolling 5,000 or more pupils.

Number 2. Finances of Special Districts—Data are shown for selected large districts.

Number 3. Finances of County Governments—Selected financial items are shown for groups of counties, classified by population-size groups, and for individual county governments.

Number 4. Finances of Municipal and Township Governments—Selected financial items are reported for population-size groups of these governments and for individual municipalities and townships having 10,000 or more inhabitants.

Number 5. Compendium of Government Finances—This report is a comprehensive summary showing data for the Federal Government, individual States, and local governments by type of government, and data for State and local governments by States, including a breakdown by type of government. Data are given for county areas, per capita amounts, percentage distributions, and State rankings.

VOLUME 5. LOCAL GOVERNMENT IN METROPOLITAN AREAS—1 report (GC82(5))

This volume presents the census findings for standard metropolitan statistical areas (SMSA's) in three major subject fields: Numbers of local governments by type and size, local government employment and payrolls, and local government finances. Data are shown in terms of nationwide aggregates for population-size groups of SMSA's and for SMSA portion of each State, as well as for individual SMSA's and their component counties.
